



CWB Onyx Balanced Solution – Series A

This document contains key information you should know about the CWB Onyx Balanced Solution, a mutual fund managed by CWB Wealth Management Ltd. What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests primarily in other CWB Onyx Portfolio Series or other mutual funds managed and advised by CWB Wealth Management Ltd. or its affiliates that invest in a diverse group of Canadian, U.S. and international equity securities, fixed income securities, and securities of real estate investment trusts (“REITs”) and similar investment vehicles to provide investors with long-term capital appreciation. The fund will generally invest its assets to achieve a target asset allocation of approximately 60% in equity securities and securities of REITs and similar investment vehicles and 40% in fixed income securities.

The charts below give you a snapshot of the fund’s investments on April 30, 2018. The fund’s investments will change.

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money. One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund’s returns change over time. This is called “volatility”.

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

CWB Wealth Management Ltd. has rated the volatility of this fund as low to medium.

This rating is based on how much the fund’s returns have changed from year to year. It doesn’t tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.


Like most mutual funds, this fund does not have any guarantees. You may not get back the money you invest.

## How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how Series A units of the fund have performed over the past completed calendar year. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

### Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series A units of the fund performed in the past completed calendar year. The fund class has not dropped in value in the last year. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund class has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund class will perform in the future.



### Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for the Series A units of the fund in a 3-month period over the past completed calendar year. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

### Average return

The annual compound return of the fund was 6.81% since February 2, 2016. As of April 30, 2018, if you had invested \$1,000 in the fund on February 2, 2016, your investment would now be worth \$1,159.16.

## Who is this fund for?

The fund may be suitable for investors who:

- have a medium to long-term investment time horizon
- are looking for long-term capital appreciation with some interest income
- are willing to accept modest fluctuations in the value of their investment and low to medium investment risk
- want a low maintenance investment vehicle
- wish to diversify their portfolio by not only asset mix, but also by investment manager and investment style
- are seeking professional advice in choosing and monitoring their asset mix

⚠ Don't buy this fund if you need a steady source of income from your investment, have a short term investment time horizon or are unwilling to accept moderate fluctuations in fund value.

## A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

## How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A units of the fund. The fees and expenses — including any commissions — can vary among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

### 1. Sales charges

No sales charges apply when you purchase units directly from CWB Wealth Management Ltd. or from Canadian Western Financial Ltd. If you purchase units through another representative, your representative may charge you a sales charge when you purchase Series A units of the fund. The sales charge is negotiable between you and your representative.

### 2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

As of December 31, 2017, the fund's expenses were 1.90% of its value. This equals \$19.00 for every \$1,000 invested.

## More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide you. CWB Wealth Management Ltd. pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The trailing commission on the Series A units of the fund is 1.0% of the value of your investment each year, or \$10.00 for every \$1,000 invested.

### 3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short term trading fee	CWB Wealth Management Ltd. has the discretion to charge you up to 2% of the value of your units if you switch or redeem your units within 60 days of buying units of the fund. This fee will be paid to the fund.

## What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- Withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund units within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- Cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
